In 1918, John Pagliero founded the Technical Porcelain and China Ware Co. in Albany, CA, and soon moved it to El Cerrito, where it produced dinnerware in a variety of wonderful patterns, from "cowboy" to tiki – and much else besides. TEPCO pieces are highly sought after today for their reflection of the "diner" era of the '40s, '50s and '60s, and many are still in daily use, often in restaurants.
