The world famous El Toro sailboat design was created in Richmond in 1940. The designers were a group of sailing enthusiasts who were interested in an easy-to-build boat design that kids could sail. They designed it so the hull could be cut out of two sheets of plywood. Many thousands of sailors - including Olympic champions - have learned to sail in an El Toro.

The new El Toro Sculpture at Boat Ramp Street on the Richmond waterfront celebrates the origin of the beloved little sailboat that is known worldwide. It is located as if the boat is sailing out into the Inner Harbor.
